# Introduction



In July 2020 DaDaFest will give 4 grants to professional disabled artists or organisations run by disabled people.



A grant is money you get from an organisation to pay for something you need. The largest amount you can apply for from us is £2,500.



The grants are for people to make brilliant pieces of art, art projects or performances.

# About DaDaFest



DaDaFest is an organisation that supports and shows work by deaf and disabled artists.



DaDaFest runs a festival every two years. This year it will be an online festival for people to watch at home.

The money for the grants also comes from another organisation which is called The Granada Foundation.

# Who can apply?



You can be from anywhere in the world.



Your project must be made by a professional disabled artist or organisation run by disabled people.

# Your project



Your artwork could be dance, theatre, sculpture, film, photography or any other type of art you choose.



If you are successful your project will go in our online festival or events, so it must be something you can share online.

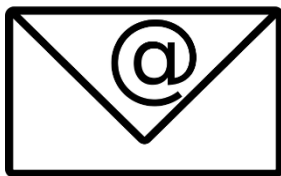


It should say something about the idea of 'Translations' because that is what the festival is about this year.

You will need to send us an application by email, either:



- As a short video or audio recording



- Or by completing an application on a computer or other device.

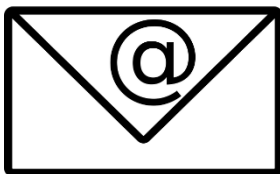
